Wednesday **Monday Tuesday Friday Thursday** Saturday Sunday Outdoor Adventure Leadership experience is available in Week 3 and Week 4 Offered in partnership with Camp Muskoka, in Bracebridge, Ontario Camping with Canadian students For students aged 12 - 16, there are over 50 adventure activities to choose from each week, in areas such as swimming, canoeing, kayaking, stand up paddle boarding, land sports, outdoor pursuits/nature studies, archery, mountain biking, and photography, etc. These fun activities are designed to strengthen our students' self-confidence, foster independence and develop valuable life skills. For students aged 14 - 16, they are also eligible to enroll in the daily leadership training. Daily leadership training activities focus on peer mediation, conflict resolution, and on building the confidence and self-esteem of the campers to help them to become strong leaders within the camp community, and to develop transferrable skills to help them to succeed in school and in their future careers.



A private room for each student; with high-speed internet connection in the student's room; three meals a day, participation in family activities.

• At the Outdoor Leadership Centre in Bracebridge, Ontario:

Students aged 12 and 13 stay in cabins. 14 to 16 years old students stay in cottages. Both cabins and cottages have washroom and shower facilities inside. All accommodations have heat and air conditioning to ensure optimal comfort, and live-in staff for safety reasons.

Students aged 14 to 16 who are enrolled in the daily leadership training stay in tents, on platforms under canopies. The tents are equipped with regular bunk beds and cubbies for their belongings. There is a shower and washroom building nearby for the campers and staff.

About our English courses:

- **General English course:** small interactive classes for students at the beginner level to intermediate level. Our course is designed under the curriculum guidelines of the Ontario Ministry of Education. It covers a wide range of interesting theme-based topics relevant to student's daily life, giving students many opportunities to develop their English communication skills.
- **Academic English course:** small interactive classes for students at the high-intermediate level or the advanced level. The course focuses on advanced topics of writing and grammar, cohesion and coherence, academic skills, presentation skills, and other language skills required for University level English.
- Creative Writing course: small interactive classes for students at an advanced English level. The course helps students learn about their world and themselves through creative writing. In this course, students will explore ideas, genres and styles of creative writing by viewing published models in print, online and through field trips. Then they try it themselves!
